Launched over a decade ago, and regularly updated and improved, IMCA's competence assurance and assessment guidance provides a framework within which its contractor members can demonstrate the competence of their personnel to both clients and regulators. The IMCA framework includes a substantial amount of documentation - set out in a straightforward manner for over 50 positions, with additional guidance for freelance personnel. Now the association has turned its attention to offshore safety advisors, a role that is fundamental to the safe and effective operations of many member companies.
