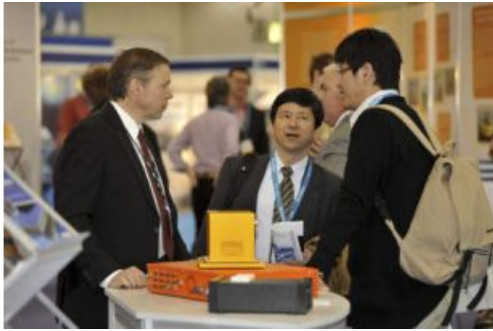


Registration Open for OI China



Six months before the inaugural Oceanology International (OI) China 2013 opens at INTEX in Shanghai (from 3 to 5 September 2013), online registration is open. Attendance of the exhibition is at no charge to anyone with a business-related or professional interest in ocean science and marine technology in all its forms.

Exhibition director James Coleman of Reed Exhibitions is looking forward to welcoming marine scientists, maritime specialists, academics, researchers and those working in government departments and commercial companies encompassing a wide range of interests from aquaculture to offshore oil and gas; subsea engineering to telecommunications; coastal engineering to marine renewable energy to this first Oceanology International 2013 China
